With this year being the 15th anniversary of the devastating attack, the students were especially devoted to their time volunteering on site, understanding the real importance of serving on this of all days.

Said Morgan student Lamonte Terry, "As a veteran, I feel like I owe it to my country to be out here, doing something for our community [as] opposed to being bitter over what [transpired] in 2001."

The students worked together restoring two houses in the Woodbourne-McCabe neighborhood. These colleges, along with others in the Baltimore area, have been supportive partners in the mission of Habitat Chesapeake, volunteering and advocating year round.
